When the cold weather arrives please remember to drive carefully as Buckingham Park is not on a gritting route. The Parish Council has placed grit bins around Buckingham Park so please do use them and we have already ordered more grit ready to refill them.

Wishing everybody a Merry Christmas and fingers crossed that we will get our roads tarmac'd in the New Year!

Weather Watch

If you can believe the Met Office's long range weather forecast, we are destined for a bad Winter with snow again predicted.

This is good news and good fun for the children – likely days off school and fun sledding. For others, life is made more difficult. In preparation, your Parish Council is refilling grit bins already located at key locations throughout the development. Past experience shows that vehicular access approaching the roundabout at the top of Col Grantham Avenue, and at certain places along Prince Rupert Drive can be skid pans and very dangerous. Because of these problems, even our bus service has been prohibited in the past from routing through Buckingham Park. AVDC does not grit any roads in Buckingham Park, so what grit is laid is done by residents on a voluntary self help basis. Gritting Jubilee Square is the joint responsibility of the main occupants and the Management Company. During these difficult times, residents can help themselves (and others) by clearing snow from their own paths and pavements outside their properties. And why not also be neighbourly in this way by helping those locally who cannot help themselves. Stoke Mandeville A&E is busy enough without the added burden of having to deal with broken bones caused by unnecessary falls that could be avoided with just a little effort across our community.

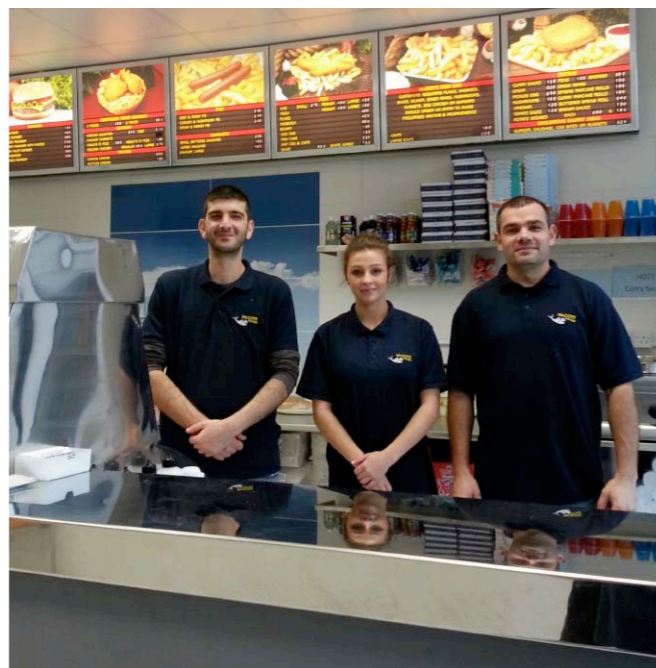

Danish Christmas Pudding (Risengrød)

Ingredients:

568ml/ 1 pint milk
75g (3 oz) pudding rice
50g (2 oz) caster sugar
4-5 drops of vanilla extract
50g (2oz) chopped almonds
1 glass sherry
300ml (½ pint) double cream
1 whole almond



Whip in the cream. Transfer to a serving dish, cover and chill in the refrigerator for about 8 hours. Before serving push the whole almond into the pudding so it is well hidden. This is a Danish tradition and it is placed in the pudding for luck. The finder receives a present!

Serve with hot cherry sauce (Kirsebærsauce).

Serves 4-6

Put the milk and rice in a saucepan and simmer for about 20 min until the rice is soft and most of the milk is absorbed.

Add the sugar, vanilla extract, almonds, sherry and stir well. Leave to cool completely.

Father Christmas has promised he'll be there – in his specially created grotto. Children who visit him will receive a special gift and can also have their photo taken.

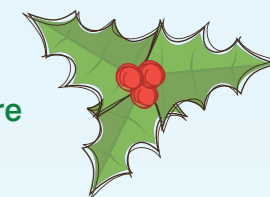
